About the Historical Society

The Bay of Plenty Maori Historical & Research Society was formed in 1933, but its activities were cut short by World War II. Much of its material was passed to the present Historical Society when it was formed in 1952 by H.D. 'Jack' London and others, who set about collecting archives, records & artefacts of the district, as well as forming a museum committee, which led to the opening of the museum in 1972. In 1958 the newsletters of the Society were transformed into Historical Review, which continues to be published. A number of significant memoirs and Monographs have also been published.

Over the years members of the Society have been involved in a considerable amount of archaeological fieldwork and occasionally excavation, for instance after the initial discovery of the Te Kohika swamp pa, near Matata, in 1974. The Society also offered its members a programme of talks and field trips.

Today many of the activities that the Society pioneered locally have been taken over by other organisations, such as the Whakatane District Council, the NZ Archaeological Association, and the NZ Historic Places Trust. The Society therefore concentrates on the publication, in association with the Tauranga Historical Society, of the Bay of Plenty's sole historical periodical, the twice-yearly Historical Review, a substantial glossy A4 magazine, which is free to members of the Societies.

One of the Society's roles today is as an advocate and watchdog for things historical, in association with local iwi, producing submissions to the appropriate bodies when the district's heritage is thought to be under threat.
